What is ICAO Doc 9859? The Safety Management Manual (SMM) (Doc 9859) Guidance material on safety management principles and concepts, State Safety Programme (SSP) and Safety Management System implementation are contained in the ICAO Safety Management Manual (SMM) (Doc 9859).

What is ICAO 17 security? As expressed in Annex 17, ICAO requires that appropriate security controls are applied to all cargo and mail before being loaded upon an aircraft, to prevent the introduction of explosives. This may be achieved through physical screening or by ensuring that cargo originates from a secure supply chain.

What is the ICAO definition of security? ICAO defines aviation security as a combination of measures and human and material resources intended to safeguard civil aviation against acts of unlawful interference.

What is the aviation security manual? In general it sets down broad principles but one of the Standards requires that dangerous goods are carried in accordance with the Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air (the "Technical Instructions").

What is ICAO Annex 19 safety? Description. Annex 19 contains overarching provisions applicable to safety management functions related to, or in direct support of, the safe operation of aircraft and highlights the importance of safety management at the State level across multiple aviation domains.

What ICAO Annex covers the security? [3]Annex 17 to the Chicago Convention lays down standards and recommended practices for the protection of the security of international air transport. The Universal Security Audit Programme was launched in 2002 to monitor ICAO contracting states' compliance with these standards.

Which number is the ICAO Annex for security? Annex 17 contains Standards and Recommended Practices concerned with the security of international air transport and is amended regularly to address the evolving threat.

What is basic AVSEC? The course is designed to train base or entry level airport security personnel to enforce, monitor and apply airport security measures in accordance with locally approved programmes, and to communicate and cooperate with other airport agencies.

What is the number 1 cybersecurity threat? 1. Social Engineering. Social engineering remains one of the most dangerous hacking techniques employed by cybercriminals, largely because it relies on human error rather than technical vulnerabilities.

Malware is the most common type of cyberattack, mostly because this term encompasses many subsets such as ransomware, trojans, spyware, viruses, worms, keyloggers, bots, cryptojacking, and any other type of malware attack that leverages software in a malicious way.
